

Zero-Day Vulnerability is a security flaw in a computer system that its developers or vendors are unaware of. It is called "0-day" because there are 0 days of protection against it. Until the vulnerability is patched or fixed, threat actors can exploit it.

What are some ways to mitigate 0-day attacks?

### **User Training:**

Educate yourself about social engineering tactics such as phishing, baiting, vishing, etc. Be suspicious of unsolicited emails, calls, or visits.
